Enhanced learning greenspace for people with developmental disabilities and the greater community

The Aptus Teaching Landscape is an enhanced learning green space offering a nature-focused educational environment and activity hub for students with developmental disabilities and the greater Toronto community. Aptus Teaching Landscape is located behind Aptus' school program. The Landscape includes a heated greenhouse, orchard, edible garden and mini-arboretum, connecting to the Mossie Park splashpad and playground.

This project demonstrates how public, private and non-profit partners can work together to place parks at the heart of communities. Key partners and supporters include The Weston Family Parks Challenge, the Ontario Trillium Foundation, Aptus Charity Golf Classic, the Zachary Van Zant Memorial Fund, Friends of Mossie Park and Councillor Augimeri.

The Landscape offers environments that are beneficial to all people and encourages inclusion for all community members. The site's ecological value has been enhanced while providing the tools for everyone to gain an improved understanding of environmental stewardship and food production.

SENSORY FOREST GARDEN

An immersive learning environment encouraging stewardship and inquiry-based, experiential learning. The introduced forest ecosystem also provides habitat for birds, insects and other animals.

MINI ARBORETUM

Canopy trees have been planted to increase tree diversity and provide much needed shade.

PLAYGROUND

Includes a swing set in memory of Zachary Van Zant, a 21-year old student whose love of nature will always be remembered.

URBAN ORCHARD

The orchard includes a berry patch and apple, cherry and Asian pear trees.

POLLINATOR GARDEN

The garden increases plant diversity and habitat for beneficial insects, like bees.
